The post holder will act as line manager for up to five Foundation Coaches (in some cases this will be direct line management; in others this will be via staff within the team).

Purpose of the Role

The aim of The Huddersfield Town Foundation is to help improve the quality of life for young people and adults across Huddersfield and the West Yorkshire area by delivering projects with a focus on Education, Sport, Health and Inclusion.

The Primary Stars Manager will have joint operational responsibility for the development, implementation and success of the Foundation's Primary Stars project and other related projects. The Primary Stars Manager will also be expected to contribute to the further development of the collective work of The Huddersfield Town Foundation, ensuring a high-quality and professional approach at all times.

Role Specific Responsibilities

The post holder will be required to:

Primary Stars

- Provide and ensure delivery of high-quality Physical Education and Educational support in schools across Kirklees and the surrounding areas;
- Develop and implement interventions and workshops that will deliver the aims of the Primary Stars project;
- Effectively and efficiently manage allocated budgets;
- Identify, create and manage strong relationships with a range of educational establishments to ensure the ongoing success of the programme;
- Develop and implement a quality assurance process for the programme;
- Ensure Teacher mentoring support is high quality, fit for purpose and meets the requirements of the National Curriculum:
- Organise Teacher CPD opportunities to further upskill teachers within Premier League Primary Stars schools;
- Lead on project reporting in line with the PLCF timeline;
- Lead on one of the National Curriculum areas (KS1 or KS2);

- Be the link to the FA PE Unit;
- Lead on pathways for participants into community programmes and grassroots sport such as PL Kicks, Wildcats and Tomorrow's Terriers;
- Ensure social action projects are delivered in line with PLCF requirements;
- Promote female engagement in physical activity both in school and community time;
- Be the link to West Ridings County FA.

Line Management

- Provide line management to Foundation Coaches who may be engaged to work for and with The Huddersfield Town Foundation from time to time;
- Manage staff within the area of responsibility to ensure the implementation of project delivery including all monitoring and evaluation requirements for funding providers;
- Adopt effective approaches in relation to managing staff, in accordance with individual needs and best practice;
- Help staff develop confidence and competence by modelling good practice and acting as a mentor;
- Undertake performance reviews on a regular basis, identifying areas of strength and development needs, and implementing strategies to support and develop each person;
- Promote a safe working environment.

Other

- Contribute to fundraising/income generation for The Huddersfield Town Foundation, and to meet annually negotiated targets relating to raising specific levels of funds, to support and sustain the work of the organisation; and,
- To work occasional match days as required.

The post holder will be required to undertake any other duties as required by the Head of Education and Sport, the Huddersfield Town Foundation Chief Executive Officer, and/or any other Senior Manager/Director.

- Be proactive with workload and interventions;
- Seek to continually develop their skills and knowledge;
